



## 2024 Forensic Science Summer Workshops for Educators Western Michigan University Rooms 1408 &1414 Wood Hall, WMU Campus Kalamazoo, Michigan 2 Workshops: June 24-28, 2024 AND July 8-12, 2024

Forensic science has become a popular science course for middle school and high school students thanks to an explosion of "CSI" type shows in the media. Science teachers find it is a great way to get students involved in *doing* science. If you are considering bringing forensic science into your classroom or wish to start or "tweak" a forensic science course in your school, this workshop will help you do just that! You will learn key forensic science concepts along with great ideas about how to teach them for large groups of students.

Tentative topics for each workshop:

- June Workshop
  - Advanced bloodstain analysis (stringing, other bloodstain activities)
  - Forensic Anthropology
  - Autopsy Ideas
  - White powder/drug analysis
  - Forensic glass analysis
  - Firearms ID
  - Accident Investigation (skid to stop), BAC calculations, Paint transfer
  - Trace Evidence: Hair & Fiber ID
  - o Setting up crime scenes (and processing evidence) for large groups of students
- July Workshop
  - Blood detection & bloodstain analysis
  - Forensic entomology: how to set up a "body farm", collect and identify larva
  - o Autopsy Ideas
  - Fingerprints: inking, dusting, and chemical detection
  - o DNA
  - Tread print analysis
  - Accident Investigation (skid to stop)
  - Setting up crime scenes (and processing evidence) for large groups of students
